



**Upcoming Projects:** This summer (our winter) we are planning two major projects which are being coordinated with groups from two churches in the States. The first will be in June when 14 people will come and help install a fresh water pump and teach hygiene classes in a village near Inhambane. Scott and several of his disciples spent time praying and researching several potential villages where we have contacts to determine which location would be the best place to start our outreach efforts. We have selected one of the six sites and are now working on the next stages of the process.

Our second project will be an English Speaking Christian Camp in July that will target the best English speakers from the local high schools and invite them to a camp over in Maxixe. The goal will be to develop relationships and expose them to Christ. As with any project, a lot of planning and “foot work” has to be done. Scott has spent a lot of time planning for these two projects. We are so excited about the possibilities. Begin praying for a harvest of new disciples from both of these projects.

Thankfully that wasn't necessary and African Tick Bite Fever, while extremely painful, is totally treatable. Scott is well on his way to recovery.
